

Breakthrough Star Award

The festival featured rising star Jonathan Majors (Ant-Man and the Wasp: Quantumania, Creed III, Magazine Dreams) for a special screening of his new film **Devotion**. At the screening, actor and VAFF board member **Jason George** presented Majors with the **Breakthrough Star Award**, acknowledging an exceptional early to mid-career actor's achievement. Following the screening, Majors was joined for a discussion with **Tyler Coates** (Hollywood Reporter).

Craft Award

The festival presented the **Craft Award**, which recognizes a distinguished and outstanding practitioner of behind-the-scenes film craft, to renowned production designer **Eugenio Caballero** before a screening of his new film *Bardo, False Chronicle of a Handful of Truths*. After the screening, Caballero was joined by **Critic-in-Residence Carlos Aguilar** (regular *LA Times, NY Times, The Wrap* contributor) for a post-screening discussion.





Gerald L. Baliles Founder's Award

Local filmmaker Jamie Sisley received the Governor Gerald L. Baliles Founder's Award at a screening of his film *Stay Awake*, which offered a deeply personal look at the familial impacts of opioid addiction. The award recognizes excellence in Virginia filmmaking. Following the screening Sisley was joined by stars Wyatt Oleff and Chrissy Metz and USA Today's film critic Brian Truitt.

Changemaker Award

The Festival presented the **Changemaker Award** to Academy Award-winning screenwriter and prominent LGBTQ+ activist **Dustin Lance Black** (*Milk, J. Edgar, Under the Banner of Heaven*). The award recognizes a filmmaker who has been a force for positive change. NPR critic **Bilal Qureshi** led the screenwriter in a discussion about the film and his work as both an artist and an activist.






Screenwriting Achievement Award

VAFF's Family Centerpiece screening of the new animated adaptation of the beloved children's book by Ruth Stiles Gannet, *My Father's Dragon*, was paired with another major award presentation: the 2022 VAFF Screenwriting Achievement Award for Meg LeFauve. This award recognizes the achievement of an exceptionally talented, creative, and compelling screenwriter.

Chronicler Award

The highly regarded documentarian **Sam Pollard** was also a special guest at the festival, with his new film **Lowndes County and the Road to Black Power**. Pollard received the **Chronicler Award**, which recognizes a documentary filmmaker who has demonstrated excellence, creative vision, and significant achievement in non-fiction filmmaking. Following the screening, Pollard joined a conversation with IndieWire writer **Robert Daniels**.





Opening Night

The 35th VAFF kicked off with a sold-out screening of *Glass Onion: A Knives Out Mystery* at The Paramount Theater. The film was introduced by Festival Director Jody Kielbasa and UVA President Jim Ryan.



Centerpiece Film

VAFF's Centerpiece screening featured the film *Women Talking*, directed by Sarah Polley. The screening of the film also featured a tribute to two-time Tony award-winning actress **Judith** Ivey, known for her incredible legacy as a stage performer, as well as her onscreen work.

The VAFF featured eleven International Oscar Contenders in the 2022 program including *Close* and *EO* along with other acclaimed films *Saint Omer, Corsage,* and *Beautiful Beings*.






Audience Demographics



Highlighted Media Coverage

Virginia Film Festival was covered extensively in media outlets locally and throughout the Commonwealth leading up to and during the Festival weekend. We also welcomed nationally recognized film critics from major entertainment and news outlets to come to Charlottesville, participate in our on-stage discussions, and interview our industry guests.

















UVA Impact and Partnerships

The 2022 Festival engaged with 24 UVA faculty and staff and 14 UVA alumni to participate in introductions and discussions in our film program, and as volunteers. We also collaborated with 9 Departments and Programs to create, host, and promote our programming to the UVA Community.

The VAFF offered UVA full-time enrolled students access to the Festival's 2022 Festival through UVA Art\$. The Festival issued 2,046 free Art\$ tickets to UVA Students. In addition, we worked directly with 60 UVA students as arts administration interns, VAFF volunteer ambassadors, and Festival events volunteers.

UVA Professor and internationally renowned filmmaker Kevin Everson's filmmaking class was also given the opportunity to speak personally with industry guests Jonathan Majors, Julie Lynn, and Kern Jackson.

Community, Accessibility, and Outreach

The **Jefferson-Madison Library Systems** partnered on VAFF's Family Centerpiece screening of *My Father's Dragon*, making the titular book the "book of the month" for young readers in Charlottesville and Albemarle County in the leadup to the Festival.

The VAFF hosted a series of free panels at the CODE building, aimed at encouraging local artists, providing industry advice, and generally bringingaudiences into direct conversation with industry guests. These insightful panels included: *From Page to Screen* screenwriting panel; *Making It* film industry career panel; and *Power of Media, Storytelling, and the Muppets of Sesame Street* panel.

Part of the VAFF's mission is to support films and filmmakers of Virginia. We partnered with the *Virginia Film Office* to present 6 Virginia-based filmmaker presentations alongside 6 VA-based short films. The VFO also announced winners of the 2022 Virginia Screenwriting Competition.

VAFF's commitment to accessibility included five screenings presented with open captions and ASL interpretation of introductions and discussions for the deaf and hard of hearing community. One of these films, *Dani's Twins*, followed the journey of a Virginia resident who became one of the first quadriplegics to give birth to twins. The screening included a discussion with producer Angie Gentile, subjects Dani Izzie, Rudy Izzie, and Dr. Robert Fuller, moderated by Eric Swensen (UVA Health).
